ATTLEBORO- Lester E. Gorman, 91, of Attleboro, passed away surrounded by his loving family on Monday, August 6, 2018 at the Garden Place HealthCare. He was the beloved husband for 57 years to the late Dorothy E. (Bergevine) Gorman, whom passed away on November 5, 2009.
