ATTLEBORO – Ronald J. Carlstrom Sr., 84, of Attleboro, passed away peacefully on Sunday, April 5, 2020 at the Life Care Center of Attleboro. He was the devoted husband for 57 years to the late Jacqueline (Tremblay) Carlstrom.

Born on February 29, 1936 in Attleboro, MA he was a son of the late Charles and Rosella (Pouliot) Carlstrom.

Ronald grew up in Attleboro and was a graduate of the Lincoln School in South Attleboro. He proudly served his country in the United States Army National Guard from 1956 – 1962, until his honorable discharge. Ronald was employed at Swanks Manufacturing, The Robbins Company and for the Mantrose-Haeuser Co., from which he retired after 40 years of employment.

He was a life member of the Attleboro Elks – Lodge #1014 and 1992 “Elk of the Year”. Ronald was also a proud member of the American Legion Post #312.

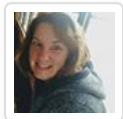

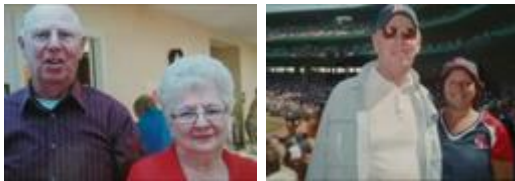
